Principal's Pen...

Thanks to all of the hard work by students, staff and families, we have made it to holidays. We all deserve 2 weeks of bliss with our families to rest and rejuvenate before Term 2 commences on 17th April. It will kick off at Ayr State School with Footsteps conducting dancing for all students. What a great way to start the new term.

It is my pleasure to announce that Ayr State School has grown so much since the commencement of the year, that we have enough students to create another class. Whilst we would all like this to start at the beginning of Term 2, causing the least disruption to students, we need to locate a teacher. The new structure will be P/1, 2/3, 4/5, 5/6, creating composite classes and not multi-age classes. I understand this may cause some families concern, but it will mean smaller class sizes across the school, benefiting each child at school. Thank you for your continued patience and trust in the school, to educate your children.

Our Priority Support Review (PSR), which commenced in 2021, is still ongoing. We had a PSR visit yesterday from Stephen Bobby (PSR Case Manager) and Suzanne Currin (Assistant Regional Director – ARD) who visited classrooms and spoke to staff whilst students were at swimming. Whilst we did not have as many students in classrooms, our visitors were able to get a sense of the curriculum being taught and look at the type of work being completed. Ayr State School was commended for increasing enrolments back up to where they were in 2020. It is evidenced that staff monitor our students and their ongoing needs, thoroughly plan curriculum and student access and reflect on current relevant data – eg Level of Achievement (LOA). Overall, we are tracking along well.

Ayr State School attendance has taken a drop and we are now at 85%. We will continue to encourage students to attend school each day, working alongside ARTIE to further motivate and reward students for high attendance. You may have noticed in Week 5, that students with 100% attendance received a certificate. This is to celebrate with the family that they are doing a wonderful job getting their child to school each day. We also understand sickness happens, but please notify the school, so it can be recorded as an explained absence.

I am enjoying being back and working amongst friendly familiar people to assist our students to achieve success. Your children bring joy to my heart each day. I am constantly greeted with smiles and hugs wherever we are throughout the day. I trust that you will cherish the next two weeks with your children until we welcome everyone back on 17th April. Have a wonderful safe Easter break.
